Teaching and Learning

Learning and teaching is our core business at SUA. We strive to ensure that all of our students have a positive experience in every lesson they attend and activity they participate in. Enjoying these lessons and activities will inevitably offer up the chance to be the 'best that they can be'. Our staff work tirelessly to ensure students are challenged and supported.

We focus very clearly on the importance of outcomes but these can only be achieved where teaching is at its best and constructive feedback is given. We encourage all of our students to participate in feedback through dialogue, both verbally and written, with their teachers. Feedback dialogue is proving to have a significant impact upon the progress that is being made.

Ofsted

Our students were a real credit to the academy during our most recent Ofsted inspection of March 2015. Behaviour was rated as 'Good' and inspectors praised the calm and sensible atmosphere within our academy. The report states: "Students behave well... they are enthusiastic about their learning and keen to do well." Similarly, Leadership and Management was rated as 'Good'. The inspection team reported that the academy shows, "a strong capacity to improve further."

Behaviour

At Staffordshire University Academy we have high expectations of behaviour and believe every student has the right to learn in a calm and productive environment. Students are expected to adopt a positive attitude to learning, ensuring they are punctual, smartly dressed and are actively engaged in lessons. Visitors are invariably impressed by our students good manners and orderly behaviour. The experienced and dedicated academy pastoral team, ensure that every child receives individual guidance, building positive relationships based on trust and mutual respect.



Celebration and Rewards

Aspire, Believe, Achieve!

The academy has a continued tradition of celebrating the success and achievements of our students. We have a rewards system where students are awarded points in lessons for demonstrating a positive attitude to learning. Students can use their points in our online rewards store exchanging these for a variety of gifts. There are opportunities throughout the year for students who have achieved the highest amount of reward points to take part in special academy activities. We hold regular celebration events for past GCSE and A Level students to celebrate their achievements.

Sixth Form

Staffordshire University Academy has a highly successful sixth form where students engage in an exciting mix of level three academic and vocational courses. Student results have increased in recent years, including the proportion of higher grades. As a result of these excellent results many of our students gain places in university each year, the majority securing their first choice courses. In addition to their qualifications, all students participate in a wide range of extra-curricular activities, including work experience, volunteer placements in the local community and charity events. Students also take on positions of responsibility in the wider academy, working as student ambassadors, supervisors of the library and also acting as teaching assistants and student mentors for younger students.



Inclusive Statement

Staffordshire University Academy is committed to providing inclusive education for all students. All staff are fully informed of student needs and work according to guidelines set by the SEND Code of Practice within the Children and Families Act 2014.

Our academy aims to provide an enriching and aspirational environment for all. Our academy is inclusive. We want all students, whatever their needs or abilities, to be happy, successful and achieve their best. Where students are identified as requiring additional support or strategies to access learning, an individual passport will be written with the student and all teachers have access to these when planning.

Within our academy we have a dedicated Progress Centre who support the educational and emotional needs of our students. This offers a variety of support services including emotional wellbeing and mental health. In addition to developing skills in literacy and numeracy and social awareness. Where necessary, the Progress Centre will signpost to other relevant agencies.

Curriculum

At Staffordshire University Academy we offer a fully inclusive curriculum package for all of our learners. The curriculum is reviewed annually and this is particularly important now as we make a transition to new Key Stage 4 specifications and a new grading system. A varied curriculum offer is in place for our sixth form including A-Level and vocational qualifications.

All students, Year 7 to 11, follow a varied curriculum which incorporates the core subjects of English, maths, science and global values. The latter incorporates: spiritual, moral, social and cultural development; personal, social and health education; study skills; British values of democracy and making a positive contribution to life in modern Britain.

We have a three year Key Stage 3 and students in Year 7, 8 and 9 follow English, maths, science, geography, history, French, Spanish, art, computer studies, music, drama, DT, catering, RE, citizenship and PE.

There is a two year Key Stage 4 at our academy. All students follow a curriculum which best suits their individual needs.

Students can select three GCSEs as well as the core diet of English, maths, science, PE and study skills. There is an alternative curriculum package for some of our students to follow with CoPE (Certificate of Personal Effectiveness) in place of an option if this is the appropriate pathway.

The sixth form curriculum is predominantly based on level three courses. Most students study a mix of academic and vocational courses. There are a choice of 15+ subjects to choose from ranging from the sciences to the more creative art and design subjects. In addition students can choose to complete an extended project. There are opportunities for students to complete additional qualifications including first aid. Students are encouraged to develop excellent study habits with support from their form tutor. They learn about the wider world and career pathways in their weekly global values lessons.





Facilities

The students and staff of SUA have occupied a fantastic new building since late 2013. There are many facilities which enhance and support the learning environment and allows students to 'Aspire, Believe and Achieve!'

Our facilities are inclusive of an Apple Mac computer room, multiple ICT suites, advanced CCTV and security systems, newly equipped catering department, sports hall, tennis courts, running track as well as fully furnished creative arts stations. The academy also houses a 'Future Technology' environment in the hub, providing students with access to a green screen and radio station.

Continuous improvements are made to further enhance the learning and recreational environment. As part of the academy's improvement plans for example, a floor to ceiling glass wall has recently been installed in reception to further safeguard students without compromising the impressive aesthetics or welcoming feel of the area.
