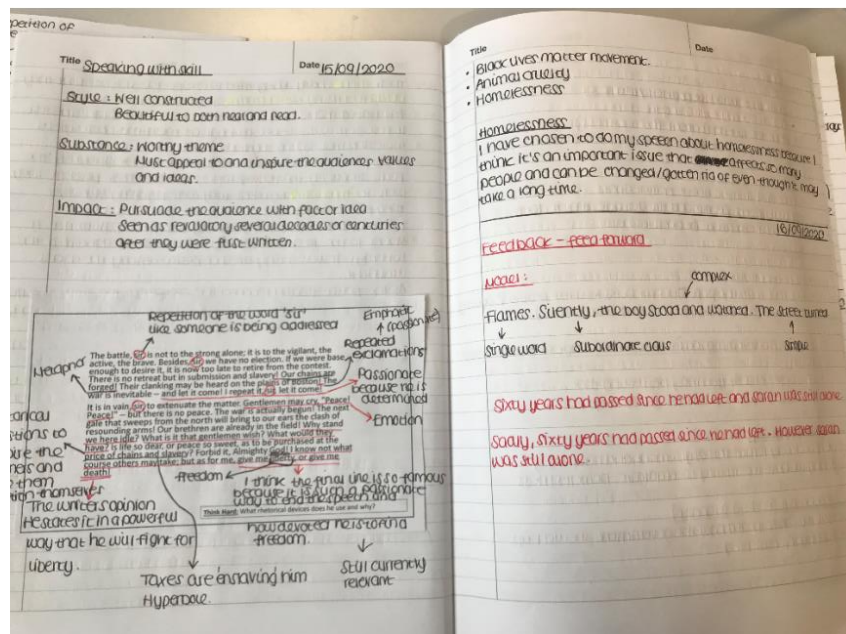
Red

Jai Wood

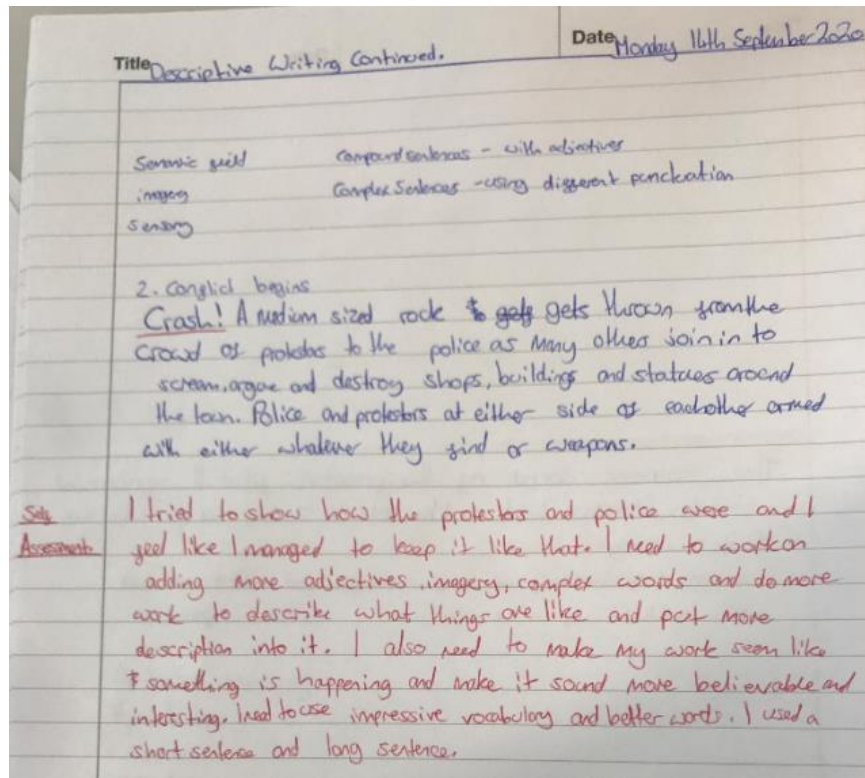

Celebrations

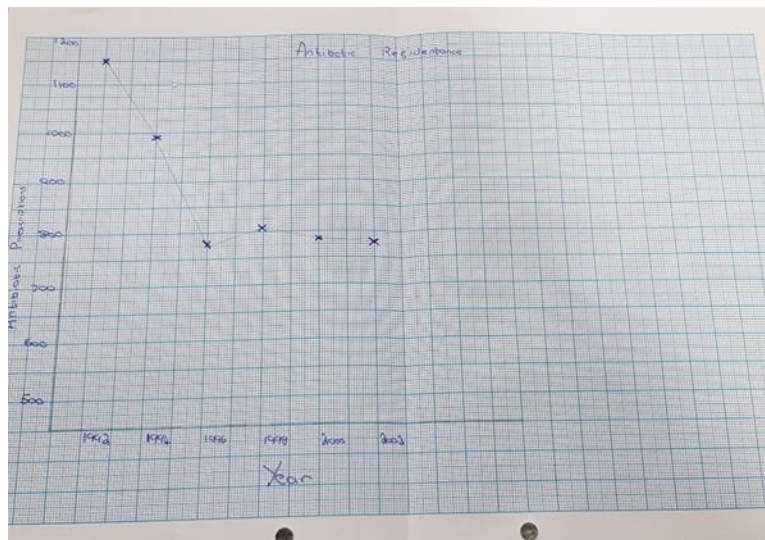
Neve Templeman has produced some excellent annotation and self-reflection work over the last week. Great work and a continuously high standard of presentation.



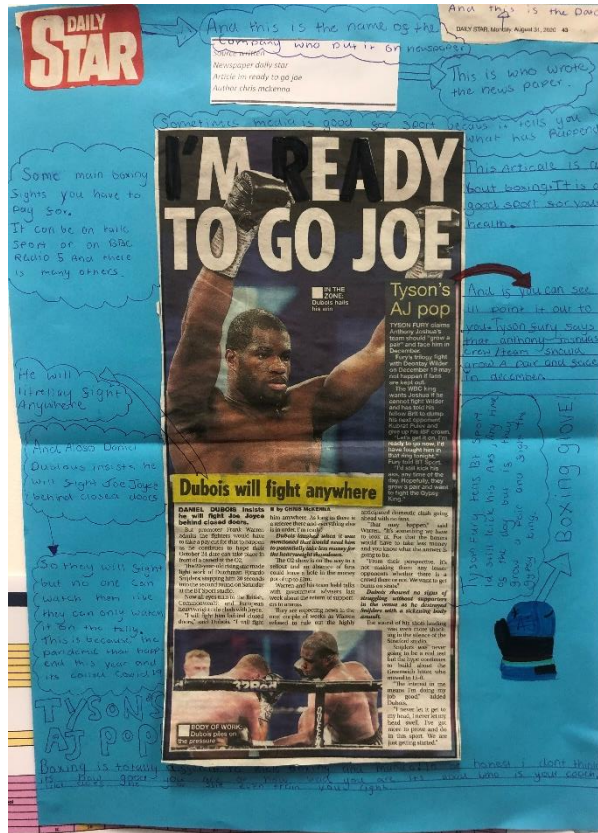
Annaliese Penn has worked hard and completed some thoughtful and purposeful self-reflection work this week
