SUA celebrates its evidence informed culture in style!

On Monday 27th June, Team SUA celebrated the hard work of staff in their second annual research showcase. Colleagues from across SUAT, including a member of the Trust Board and the interim-CEO, came along to see some of the excellent work that has been undertaken. All staff at SUA (teaching, non-teaching, business and site) complete an evidence informed research project in an area of their choice to help them to self-improve within their role. Some of the topics covered this year were staff wellbeing, curriculum conversations, SEN, SEMH support, motivating millennials, cost efficiency, site improvements and many, many more.

Staff were treated to two keynote speakers, Jonathan Peach from The Art of Brilliance, who shared top tips for staff wellbeing and 'Mental Wealth'. The second keynote speaker was Ross Morrison-McGIII, who is better known as @TeacherToolkit, sharing ideas around embedding evidence informed culture. Ross is ranked number one across all social media platforms nationally for teaching pedagogy and he had some amazing feedback to share:













Learning Talk

In the spirit of Team SUA students have been taking part in weekly sessions during tutor time called 'Learning Talk'. This is our opportunity to share with students the strategies that teachers are using to help increase their brain productivity within a lesson. During the spring term students learned about memory and strategies that we can deploy to help our memory. These sessions included lots of activities to show the students how to improve their memory and these are mirrored in activities in lessons.



During the first half of the summer term students completed a series of sessions on 'Challenge' and why this is so important to help us learn and progress. If we only ever practise what we can already do we will never make any progress. Here at SUA we believe that lessons should be challenging and that this will enable our students to thrive.

This half term we have shared all our questioning strategies with our students. Questioning underpins all of our teaching and learning and students have been learning about different types of questions in lessons, when these are used and how they help us to learn.





Rewards Day



This half term brought us the day that we had been waiting all year for: Rewards Day! On Thursday 30th June, all students at the academy had the option to either go to Alton Towers theme park (as chosen by the students) or take part in a range of activities at the academy to say a big well done for all of their hard work and achievements throughout this year.

Almost 400 students and staff boarded the 8 coaches and headed to Alton to 'unleash the power of the towers'! Both staff and students had a great time, with everyone taking advantage of the good weather (before the rain) to explore everything that the park had to offer! At the academy, the remaining students took part in a variety of activities in the morning such as science experiments and mathematical artistry. In the afternoon, students then had the option to go to the SUA cinema to watch 'Spiderman: No Way Home' with popcorn and drinks, or take part in a range of sporting activities. The students really enjoyed the opportunity to have a day of creativity and fun!

KS3/4 Leadership - Sport


