Having introduced our new behaviour system at start of this academic year with great success in ensuring our students are able to enjoy their time here at the academy with reductions in low level disruption.










Please find a reminder of the system below:

SUA Behaviour System 22/23



If a child interrupts learning twice being issued a same day 30-minute detention. This will be nonnegotiable and follows the guidance from the Department for Education, which also states that 'Schools don't have to give parents notice of after-school detentions or tell them why a detention has been given'. If a child interrupts learning further, or fails to attend this detention it will escalate to a 60 minute detention.

If your child lives in our ever growing catchment area and catches the coach to and from the academy and makes incorrect decisions and is issued a detention, you will be given 24 hours to arrange alternative arrangements for collecting them to take home.

Following the RESPECT code and changing behaviour after the warning remains the most effective way of not being in a detention. Rewards will continue to be our priority in rewarding all of the positive behaviour that we regularly see here at SUA.


Use of Time Out Cards and Toilet Passes

On rare occasions we may issue a Time Out card or a Toilet Pass – these are only awarded with medical or professional evidence. If you feel your child should have either please can the evidence be sent into the academy. Without evidence no passes will be issued.









All passes will be issued into the student planner. If a child does not bring their planner into the academy, they will not be allowed to leave class. Please rest assured that children who have medical need will be issued a pass as soon as evidence is sent into the academy.

Standards of Uniform

Following student voice last year, it was unanimously decided that tailored shorts are now be part of our uniform policy. As the warm weather approaches, we wanted to remind families of this.

In addition to this reminder, we would like to confirm the following points:

- Students trousers must be tailored. Students are not permitted to wear leggings, black jeans, jeggings or cropped trousers.
- Footwear must be black school shoes these must not include logos and should not be trainer type shoes.
- No facial piercings, such as nose (stud, ring or cow ring style) or eyebrow piercings, are permitted and this includes clear studs or retainers. Any student with a facial piercing, ear-bar or hooped earrings will be expected to remove these. Items will be held on reception until the end of the day for repeat offenders.

We would also like to remind families that a plain black v-neck jumper is an optional part of our uniform.
